MRT CORP AWARDS 4 WORK PACKAGES

Kuala Lumpur, 12 July 2012: Mass Rapid Transit Corporation Sdn Bhd (MRT Corp) today awarded four work packages for the MRT Sungai Buloh-Kajang project with a total value of RM 767 million. The awards were made following a sitting of the One-Stop Procurement Committee (OSPC) in Putrajaya which was chaired by Minister of Finance II YB Dato' Seri Ahmad Husni Hanadzlah.

The OSPC awarded TSR Bina Sdn Bhd with Package MSPR1 which is for the construction and completion of a multistorey carpark building, external works and other associated works at Sungai Buloh station. The contract is worth RM117.1 million.

TSR Bina Sdn Bhd was also the successful bidder for Package DPT2 for the construction and completion of the Kajang Maintenance Depot, administrative building, external and associated works. The contract price is RM212.8 million.

The OSPC also awarded Naim Engineering Sdn Bhd with Package S4 which is for the construction and completion of the Section 16, Pusat Bandar Damansara and Semantan elevated stations and other associated works. The contract is worth RM208.2 million.

Meanwhile, Package S5 which is for the construction and completion of the Taman Bukit Ria, Taman Bukit Mewah, Leisure Mall and Plaza Phoenix was secured by IJM Construction Sdn Bhd. The tender is valued at RM 228.9 million. IJM Construction Sdn Bhd had previously been awarded Package V5 for the construction of the viaduct guideway from the Maluri Portal to Plaza Phoenix where these four stations are located.

Package MSPR1 received bids from 17 tenderers. Package DPT2, which is a package for bumiputera companies, received bids from 7 out of 8 pre-qualified tenderers. Package S4, which is an open package, received bids from 11 out of 14 pre-qualified tenderers while Package S5, which is also an open package, received bids from 8 out of 14 pre-qualified tenderers.

With these awards, both depot packages for the MRT Sungai Buloh-Kajang project have been awarded.

Packages MSPR1 is the first of 9 multi-storey carpark packages to be awarded while the remaining 8 packages will be out for tender soon.

Package S4 and S5 are the first 2 of a total of 8 elevated station packages to be awarded for the project. Of the remaining 6 station packages, 3 are currently under evaluation while the remaining 3 are out for tender. Five out of the 8 station packages are bumiputera packages.

About the MRT Project

MRT is a new rail transport system for the Klang Valley. It is part of the government's Greater Kuala Lumpur/Klang Valley's National Key Economic Area (NKEA), under the Economic Transformation Programme. The Sungai Buloh – Kajang (SBK) Line runs for 51kms, from the north-west town of Sg Buloh to the south-east city town of Kajang. Upon completion, it will comprise 31 stations, and serve 1.2 million people along the route. It will also have strategic integration with KL's existing rail transport network, namely the LRT, Monorail and KTM Komuter, as well as intra and inter-city bus routes. The end result will be better connectivity for KL and its surrounding cities, while reducing the number of cars that enter the capital.
