LANE CLOSURES IN CHERAS AND BUKIT BINTANG

Kuala Lumpur, 12 February 2013: Mass Rapid Transit Corporation (MRT Corp) wishes to announce temporary lane closures at the following locations:

Cheras

- 1) Night closure of the left-most lane on the slip road from MRR2 to Jalan Cheras (Kuala Lumpur bound) near Tesco Taman Midah for seven days from **15 February 2013 to 21 February 2013** to facilitate utilities relocation works along the 5m stretch of the road. The lane closure will be effective from 9pm to 5am.

- 2) Night closure of the left-most lane of Jalan Cheras (Kajang bound) near Taman Segar in front of the Esso and Caltex Petrol Stations for 65 days from **18 February 2013 to 20 April 2013** to facilitate utilities relocation works along the 200-meter stretch of the road. The lane closure will be done in stages effective from 9pm to 5am.

- 3) Night closure of the left-most lane on the Jalan Cheras-Taman Len Sen ramp for 15 days from **18 February 2013 to 5 March 2013** to facilitate tree relocation activities along the 250 meter stretch of the road. The lane closure will be effective from 10pm to 5am.

- 4) Night closure of the two left traffic lanes of a 150 meter stretch of the Lebuhraya Hubungan Timur Barat underpass (Kajang bound) for 10 nights from **18 February 2013 to 28 February 2013** to facilitate tree relocation activities. The lane closure will be effective from 10pm – 5am.

Bukit Bintang

MRT Corp also wishes to announce the extension of the temporary night lane closures in Bukit Bintang, involving parts of Jalan Sultan Ismail and Jalan Bukit Bintang from **15 February 2013** until **28 February 2013**.

The lane closures, which had been implemented since 25 January 2013, involve one lane at a time and are being implemented in stages between 12:00am and 6:00am. The lane closures are to facilitate utility works in the area and it is an essential process in the construction of the Mass Rapid Transit's (MRT) underground Bukit Bintang station.

Safety barriers, traffic cones and traffic flagman will be implemented to ensure road users are pre-warned of on-going works. MRT Corp apologises for any temporary inconvenience caused to the public during the construction of this world-class public transport facility that will benefit Malaysians at large.
