SMOOTHER OPERATION: Work on the Sungai Buloh-Kajang MRT alignment project is being done at night to reduce inconvenience to road users

MASS Rapid Transit Corporation Sdn Bhd (MRT Corp) has started to carry out work at night on the 51km Sungai Buloh-Kajang MRT alignment project daily.

MRT Corp strategic communications and public relations director Amir Mahmood Razak said this was to minimise traffic disruption during peak hours.

The night works are expected to be completed at the end of next year.

"The MRT alignment runs through populated areas as well as along major roads and highways which are always congested.

"By carrying out some of the work at the night, we can minimise inconvenience to road users," he said.

The work carried out at night include utility piloting, detection and
