

MEDIA RELEASE**CONTINUATION OF CLOSURES FOR THE MRT PROJECT**

Kuala Lumpur, 5 February 2014: Mass Rapid Transit Corporation (MRT Corp) wishes to announce the following:

(i) Traffic management update for Sprint Highway/Maarof Interchange

- **Continuation of temporary night closure of left-most and middle lanes of Sprint Highway (PJ-bound) at the flyover above Maarof Interchange**

Both the left-most and middle lanes of Sprint Highway (PJ-bound) at the flyover above Maarof Interchange, will continue to be closed intermittently between 8 February 2014 and 28 February 2014 from 10:00pm to 5:00am.

During the closure, one lane (the right-most lane) will be available for motorists heading towards Petaling Jaya. *(Please refer to appended Map 1.)*

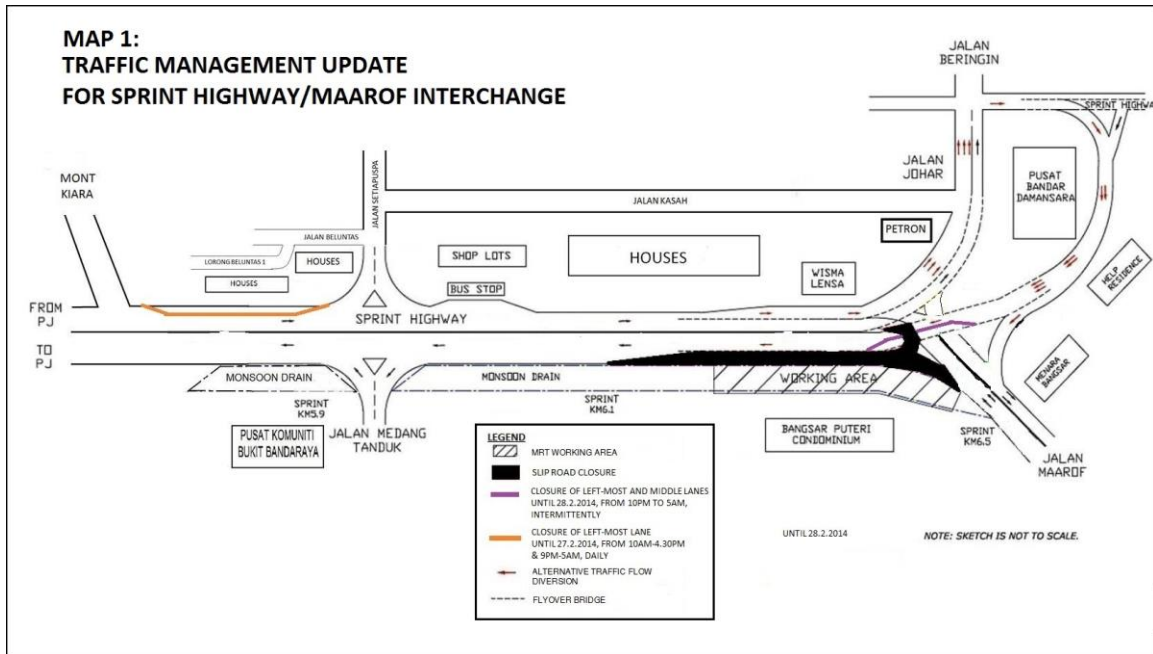
This closure is necessary to accommodate large construction machineries needed to facilitate portal works for the construction of the future Pusat Bandar Damansara Station.

- **Continuation of left-most lane (off-peak hours) closure at Sprint highway (KL-bound), at Bukit Kiara Interchange to junction of Jalan Setiapuspa**

The closure of the left-most lane of Sprint highway (KL-bound) will be extended until 27 February 2014, from 10:00am to 4.30pm, and from 9:00pm to 5:00am daily.

The closure which stretches from Bukit Kiara Interchange to the junction of Jalan Setiapuspa (KL-bound) is necessary to facilitate caisson and concreting works for the construction of the retaining wall. *(Please refer to appended Map 1.)*

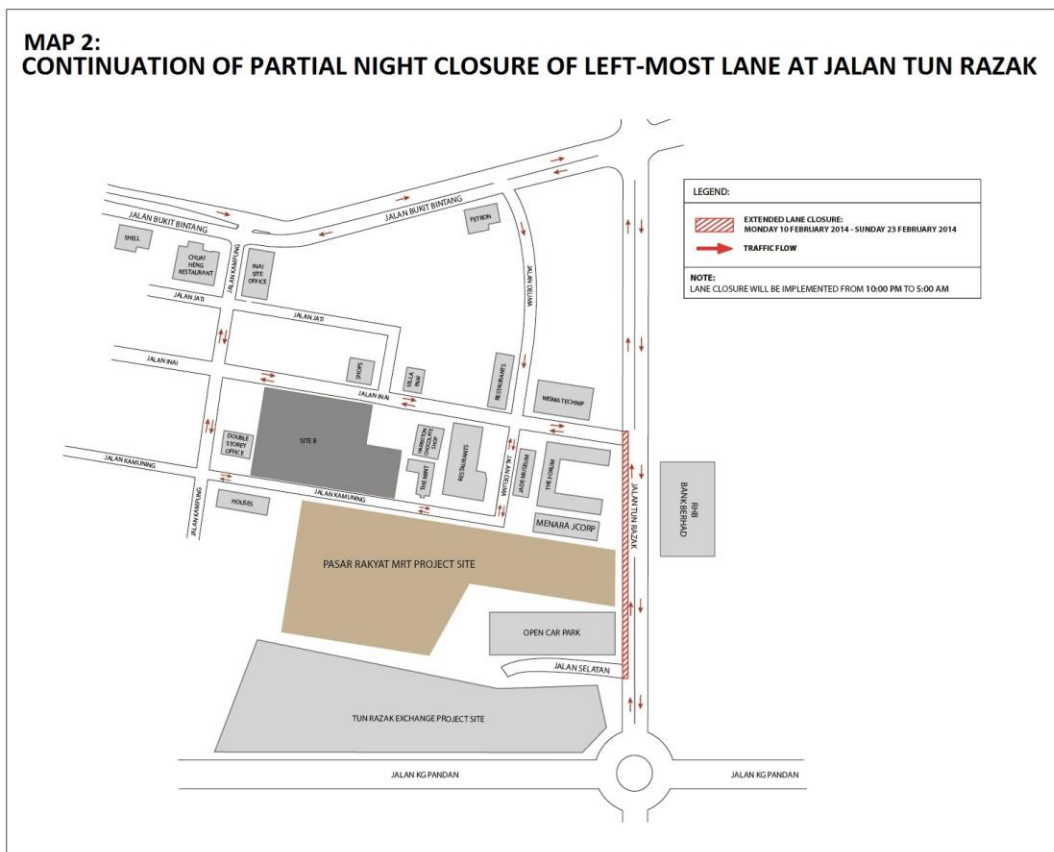
**MAP 1:

(ii) Continuation of partial night closure of left-most lane at Jalan Tun Razak

There will be a two-week extension of the partial night closure of the left-most lane at Jalan Tun Razak beginning **10 February 2014 to 23 February 2014, between 10:00pm to 5:00am daily.**

The lane closure involves a 400-metre stretch from the junction of Jalan Selatan to Jalan Inai. The extension is needed to further facilitate manhole inspection works along the road for MRT construction works. *(Please see appended Map 2.)*

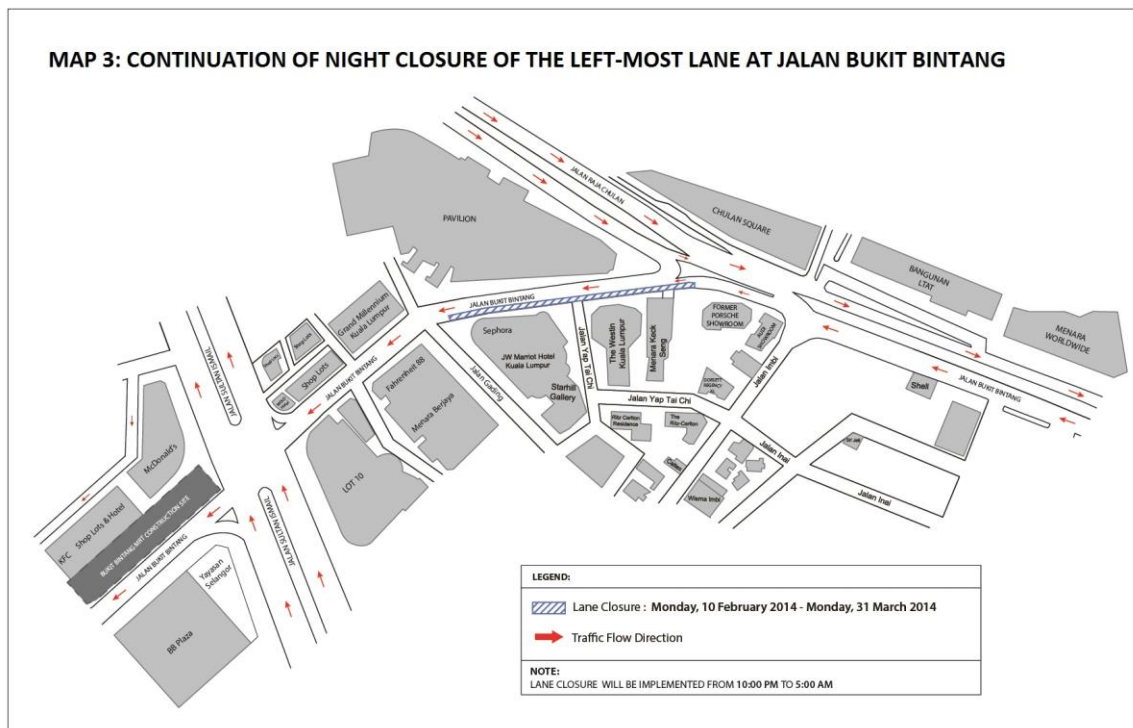


(iii) Continuation of night lane closure at Jalan Bukit Bintang

There will be a continuation of the night lane closure at Jalan Bukit Bintang, beginning **10 February 2014 to 31 March 2014, between 10:00pm to 5:00am daily**. (Closure will not be implemented on Friday and Saturday nights.)

The closure involves a 400-metre stretch on the left-most lane of Jalan Bukit Bintang, between Menara Keck Seng and Starhill Gallery. (*Please see appended Map 3.*)

The closure is necessary to facilitate soil investigation works for the construction of the MRT.

About the MRT Project

MRT is a new rail transport system for the Klang Valley. It is part of the government's Greater Kuala Lumpur/Klang Valley's National Key Economic Area (NKEA), under the Economic Transformation Programme. The Sungai Buloh – Kajang (SBK) Line runs for 51kms, from the north-west town of Sg Buloh to the south-east city town of Kajang. Upon completion, it will comprise 31 stations, and serve 1.2 million people along the route. It will also have strategic integration with KL's existing rail transport network, namely the LRT, Monorail and KTM Komuter, as well as intra and inter-city bus routes. The end result will be better connectivity for KL and its surrounding cities, while reducing the number of cars that enter the capital.
