TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN FOR PERSIARAN SURIAN AND JALAN CHERAS

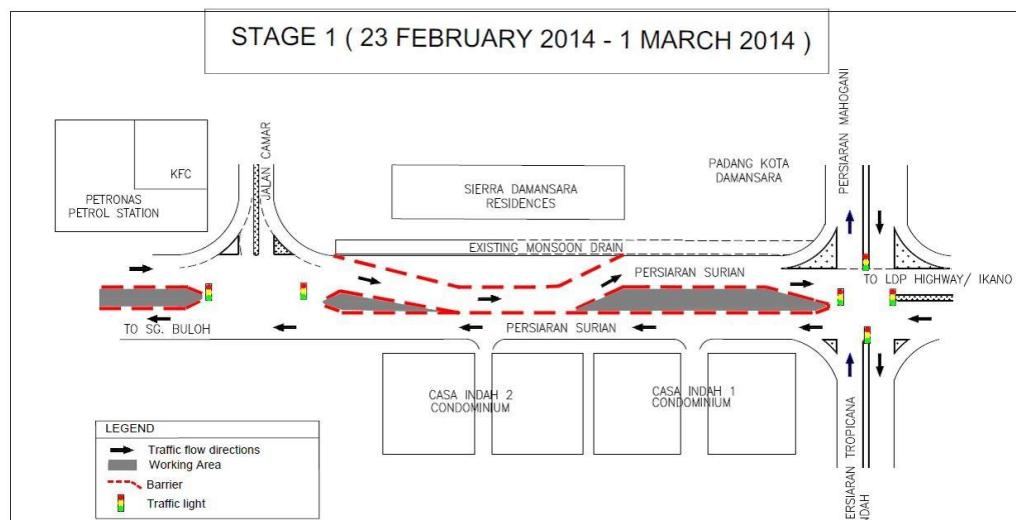
Kuala Lumpur, 22 February 2014: Mass Rapid Transit Corporation Sdn Bhd (MRT Corp) wishes to announce the following:

- **Traffic management plan for Persiaran Surian (Jalan Camar – Sunway Giza stretch), in preparation for the construction of underpass and MRT Dataran Sunway Station:**

- Temporary lane realignment at Persiaran Surian (LDP Highway-bound) near Jalan Camar**

Traffic lanes at Persiaran Surian (LDP Highway-bound) right after Petronas/KFC near the junction of Jalan Camar will be temporarily realigned to the right, from **25 February 2014 to 1 March 2014**.

Motorists are assured that two lanes will remain available during this period. (*Please refer to appended Map 1.*) This realignment is to accommodate road widening works at the left side near the existing monsoon drain.



MAP 1: TEMPORARY LANE REALIGNMENT AT PERSIARAN SURIAN

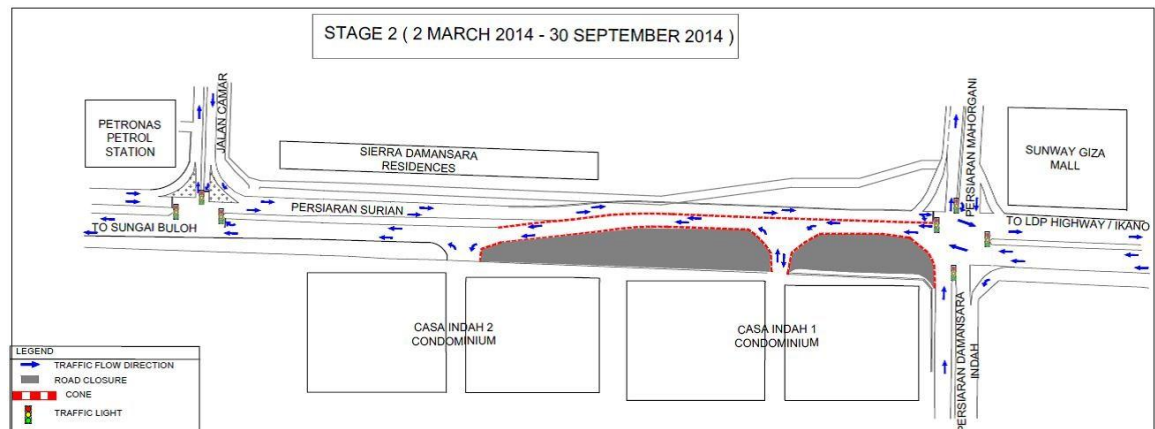
ii. Temporary traffic diversion at Persiaran Surian (Sungai Buloh-bound) after Persiaran Mahogani intersection

A temporary traffic diversion will be implemented at Persiaran Surian (Sungai Buloh-bound) after Persiaran Mahogani, from **2 March 2014 to 30 September 2014**.

Motorists heading to Sg.Buloh direction will be diverted to the right-side of Persiaran Surian. *(Please refer to appended Map 2).*

Two traffic lanes will be available for both directions (Sungai Buloh- and LDP Highway-bound) during this period. Residents of Casa Indah 1 Condominium will have a dedicated tapered lane from Persiaran Surian to enter/exit. Meanwhile, there is no traffic reconfiguration for Casa Indah 2 Condominium's residents to enter/exit Persiaran Surian.

This traffic diversion is needed to accommodate the construction of underpass and MRT piers.



MAP 2: TEMPORARY TRAFFIC DIVERSION AT PERSIARAN SURIAN

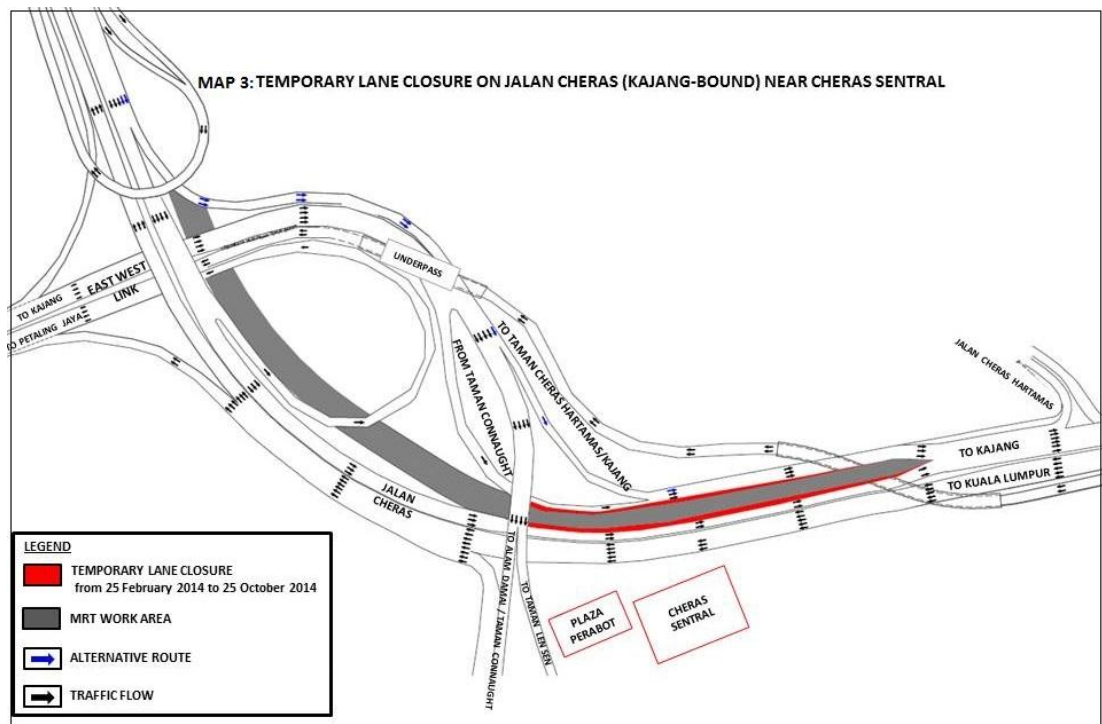
- **Temporary lane closure at Jalan Cheras (Kajang-bound) near Cheras Sentral**

The left-most lane of Jalan Cheras from Kuala Lumpur heading towards Kajang (near Cheras Sentral – formerly known as Plaza Phoenix), will be closed for a stretch of 200 metres for **8 months, effective 25 February 2014 to 25 October 2014**.

As part of the traffic management plan for this closure, the right-most lane from East-West Link Expressway will be partially closed for a short stretch of 200 metres to enable sufficient tapering for the lane closure. *(Please see appended Map 3.)*

As an alternative to access Jalan Cheras (Kajang-bound), motorists coming from Kuala Lumpur are advised to use the slip road heading towards Taman Cheras Hartamas to get onto Jalan Cheras.

This closure is needed to accommodate piling and pier construction works for the MRT piers leading to the future MRT Plaza Phoenix Station.

The Sungai-Buloh Kajang Line will comprise 31 stations, and serve 1.2 million people along the route. It will also have strategic integration with KL's existing rail transport network, namely the LRT, Monorail and KTM Komuter, as well as intra and inter-city bus routes. The end result will be better connectivity for KL and its surrounding cities, while reducing the number of cars that enter the capital.

The closure is a key part of our safety practice at all MRT construction sites. It will ensure that any risk of public injury is minimised. Motorists are reminded to drive carefully near MRT worksites and to follow directional signs.

Safety barriers, hoardings and traffic cones will be installed at the work sites to ensure road users and pedestrians are well-informed of on-going works. In addition, a 24-hour MRT Ronda will be patrolling along the routes to attend to any emergencies.

MRT Corp wishes to apologise for any temporary inconvenience caused to the public during the construction of this world-class public transport facility that will benefit Malaysians at large.
