MRT CORP WELCOMES DATO' SUTINAH SUTAN TO ITS BOARD OF DIRECTORS

She brings vast experience in the prevention of corruption and malfeasance to the MRT Project

Kuala Lumpur, 12 March 2015: Mass Rapid Transit Corporation Sdn Bhd (MRT Corp) wishes to welcome former Malaysian Anti-Corruption Commission (MACC) Deputy Chief Commissioner (Prevention) Dato' Sutinah Sutan to its Board of Directors.

MRT Corp Chief Executive Officer Dato' Sri Shahril Mokhtar said Dato' Sutinah appointment, which was effective 25 November 2014, brings extensive experience to MRT Corp, especially in the areas of prevention of corruption and malfeasance.

"MRT Corp will benefit tremendously from her vast experience and insights, having served in the MACC for 34 years, where she has held positions as investigator, director and finally as Deputy Chief Commissioner.

"Her appointment will certainly help drive MRT Corp's commitment towards a business environment that is transparent and free from corruption," he said.

Dato' Sutinah was Deputy Chief Commissioner (Prevention) of the MACC from 2010 until she retired in June 2014. She is the first woman to be appointed Commissioner in the MACC.

Prior to that, she has held several senior posts including Director of Community Education, and the Director of the Inspection and Consultation Division. She was also State Director of Penang and Pahang.

Dato' Sutinah had also held many strategic roles and responsibilities, both locally and overseas.

Among them are Chief Secretariat to the Public Sector Governance Committee (now known as the Committee on Integrity and Governance), Chairperson for a task force responsible for drafting instrument on values auditing in the public sector, Chairperson for the Corporate Integrity Pledge Roundtable Partners, member of the taskforce in drafting the National Integrity Plan, member in the Governance and Integrity Committee for the



Performance Management and Delivery Unit of the Prime's Minister's Department (PEMANDU) and for the Selangor State Development Board (PKNS).

At a regional and international level, Dato' Sutinah was a member of the APEC SME Expert Working Group on the Code of Business Ethics, ADB-OECD Anti-Bribery Initiatives for Asia and the Pacific, and APEC Expert Group on Anti-Corruption and Transparency.

She was a member of the MRT Executive Committee from 2010 to 2014.

Dato' Sutinah holds a Bachelor Degree with Honours in Humanities from Universiti Sains Malaysia, majoring in Mass Communication.

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About the MRT Project

The MRT is a new urban rail system for the Klang Valley.

The first MRT Line, the 51km Sungai Buloh-Kajang Line will comprise of 31 stations, and serve 1.2 million people along the route.

The MRT Sungai Buloh-Serdang-Putrajaya Line, the second MRT line to be built, was approved by the Government in February 2014. The proposed alignment is expected to go for public display in the second quarter of 2015 and the final alignment is targeted for approval in August 2015.

The Klang Valley MRT will integrate with the Klang Valley's existing rail transport network, namely the LRT, Monorail and KTM Komuter, as well as intra and inter-city bus routes. The end result will be better connectivity for Kuala Lumpur and its surrounding cities, while reducing the number of cars that enter the capital.

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
