

**SUNGAI BULOH-SERDANG-PUTRAJAYA LINE (SSP): LONG-TERM TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN ON
PERSIARAN KLCC/JALAN BINJAI - ROAD CLOSURE ALONG JALAN BINJAI AND STAGE 1
REALIGNMENT OF JALAN LUMBA KUDA FOR MRT CONTRUCTION WORKS**

Location	Jalan Lumba Kuda and Jalan Binjai
Date	Jalan Binjai (1 October 2016 till December 2021) Jalan Lumba Kuda (1 October 2016 till 28 February 2017)

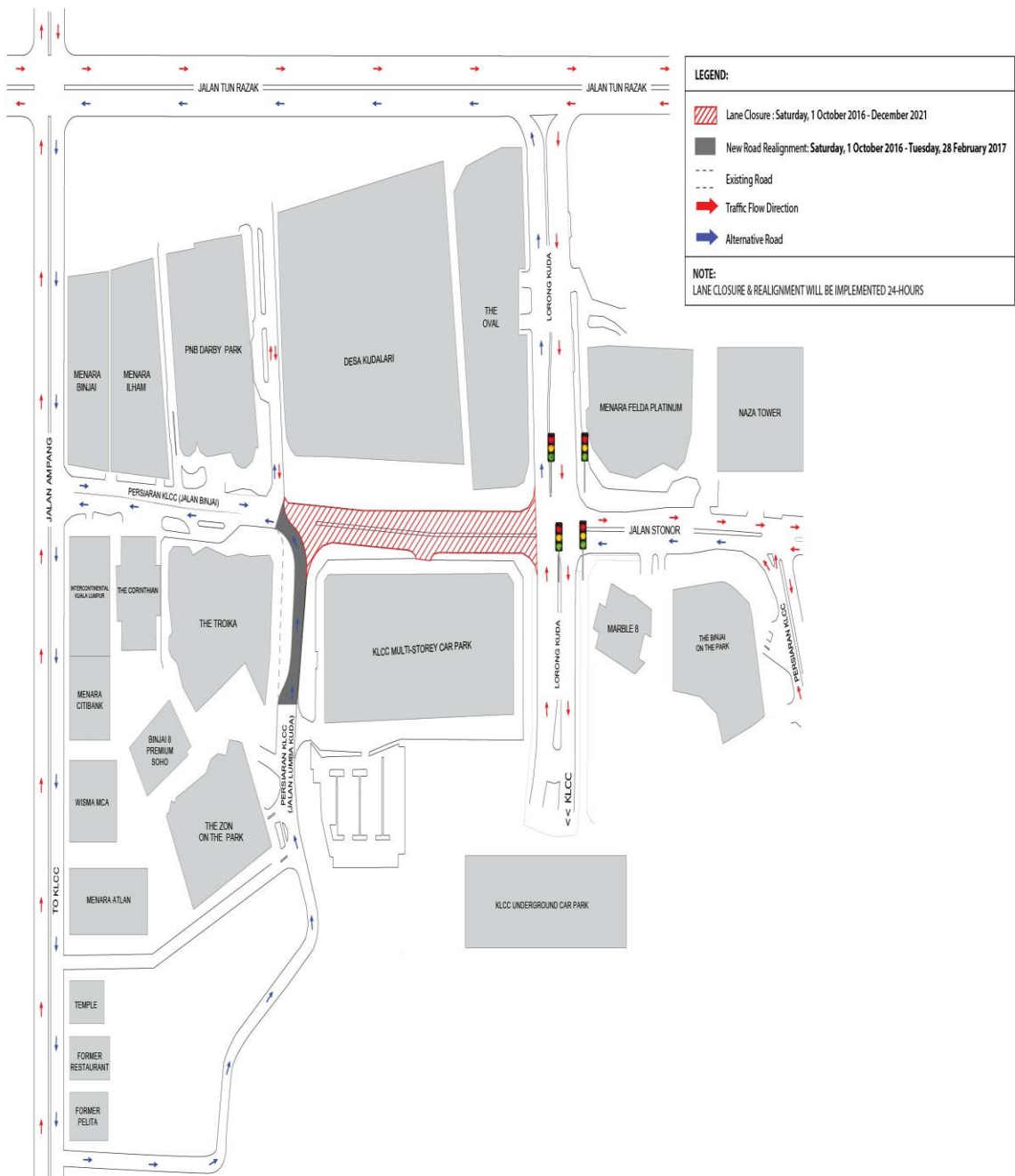
KUALA LUMPUR, 27 September, 2016: MMC Gamuda KVMRT (T) Sdn Bhd (MGKT) wishes to announce the implementation of a long-term traffic management plan on Persiaran KLCC, involving the long term closure of a section of Persiaran KLCC/Jalan Binjai and the realignment of Jalan Lumba Kuda beginning **1 October 2016**.

The Closure is as per **Federal Government Gazette dated 9 September 2016** and Traffic Management Plan has been approved by the Kuala Lumpur City Hall (DBKL).

The closure in Persiaran KLCC/Jalan Binjai, affecting a 180-metre stretch between the traffic lights in front of PNB Darby Park to the traffic lights at the entrance to the KLCC underground carpark, will be implemented between **1 October 2016 and December 2021** while the realignment of Jalan Lumba Kuda will be implemented **from 1 October 2016 till 28 February 2017**.

The traffic management plan is critical to facilitate the construction of the S17 MRT Station which is one of the 11 Underground Stations under the Sungai Buloh-Serdang-Putrajaya (SSP) Alignment. Please see map below on the road closure and road alignment.

LONG-TERM TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN ON PERSIARAN KLCC: CLOSURE OF JALAN BINJAI & ROAD REALIGNMENT ON JALAN LUMBA KUDA



Following the closure of Persiaran KLCC/Jalan Binjai, the following changes to the existing traffic will take place:

- Traffic from Jalan Binjai (in front of PNB Darby Park) intending to get into Jalan Tun Razak will now have to head towards Jalan Ampang and make a U-turn at the Jalan Ampang - Jalan Yap Kwan Seng intersection before heading for Jalan Tun Razak.

- From Lorong Kuda, a right turn into Jalan Binjai will no longer be allowed at the traffic light junction at the entrance of the KLCC underground carpark. Motorists will need to make a U-Turn at this junction to head into Jalan Tun Razak and access Jalan Binjai via Jalan Ampang.
- Traffic from Jalan Stonor will not be able to go straight towards Jalan Binjai. Motorists will need to turn right at the traffic lights at the junction of the entrance and the KLCC underground carpark to head into Jalan Tun Razak and access Jalan Binjai via Jalan Ampang.
- Traffic exiting KLCC underground car park will not be able to turn left into Jalan Binjai. Instead motorists will need to go straight to Jalan Tun Razak and access Jalan Binjai via Jalan Ampang.
- Traffic exiting the road behind Menara PNB and the side of PNB Darby Park will not be able to turn left onto Jalan Binjai to head towards Jalan Tun Razak or Jalan Stonor. Instead, motorist will have to turn right into Jalan Binjai and head towards Jalan Ampang.

For the realignment of Jalan Lumba Kuda involving 170-metre stretch, the traffic flow will be as follows:

- The original two-way road will be converted into a single direction from Persiaran KLCC heading towards the traffic lights near The Troika. The two lane road will be narrowed to become a single lane road.
- Traffic will not be able to turn right onto Jalan Binjai to head towards Jalan Tun Razak or Jalan Stonor. Instead motorists can only turn left at the traffic lights near The Troika and head towards Jalan Ampang.
- Access to The Zon Hotel and As Syakirin Mosque is accessible only via Jalan Ampang and Persiaran KLCC.

The closure and the Traffic Management Plan have been communicated to the stakeholders via private and group engagements since June 2016.

Motorists are advised to follow the directional signage during the closure and road realignment and the MRT Project Emergency Response Team will be deployed to help direct traffic.
