

# More connectivity via MRT

**PETALING JAYA:** More public facilities and places of worship are set to be made accessible via the Mass Rapid Transit (MRT) service once its phase two commences.

Prime Minister Datuk Seri Najib Abdul Razak said the rail project was a “holistic network” and that the service will connect users to a total 22 places of worship, 19 schools and eight healthcare centres.

“Sekolah Menengah Bandar Utama, Kuala Lumpur Baptist Church, Kajang Specialist Hospital and many other schools, places of worship as well as healthcare centres will be made more accessible

through MRT Malaysia #JomNaikMRT,” he wrote.

Najib is set to launch the second phase of the MRT Sungai Buloh-Kajang (SBK) Line between Semantan and Kajang on July 17.

Phase Two will cover 19 stations, including seven underground stops. Phase One started operations on Dec 16 last year, covering 12 stations from Sungai Buloh to Semantan, spanning 21km.

Work for the MRT second line, the Sungai Buloh-Serdang-Putrajaya Line, is ongoing and is expected to be completed in 2022, while a third line is on the drawing board.
