TRAFFIC MANAGEMENT PLAN ANNOUNCEMENT

Kuala Lumpur, 28 April 2014: Mass Rapid Transit Corporation Sdn Bhd (MRT Corp) wishes to announce the following traffic management announcement:

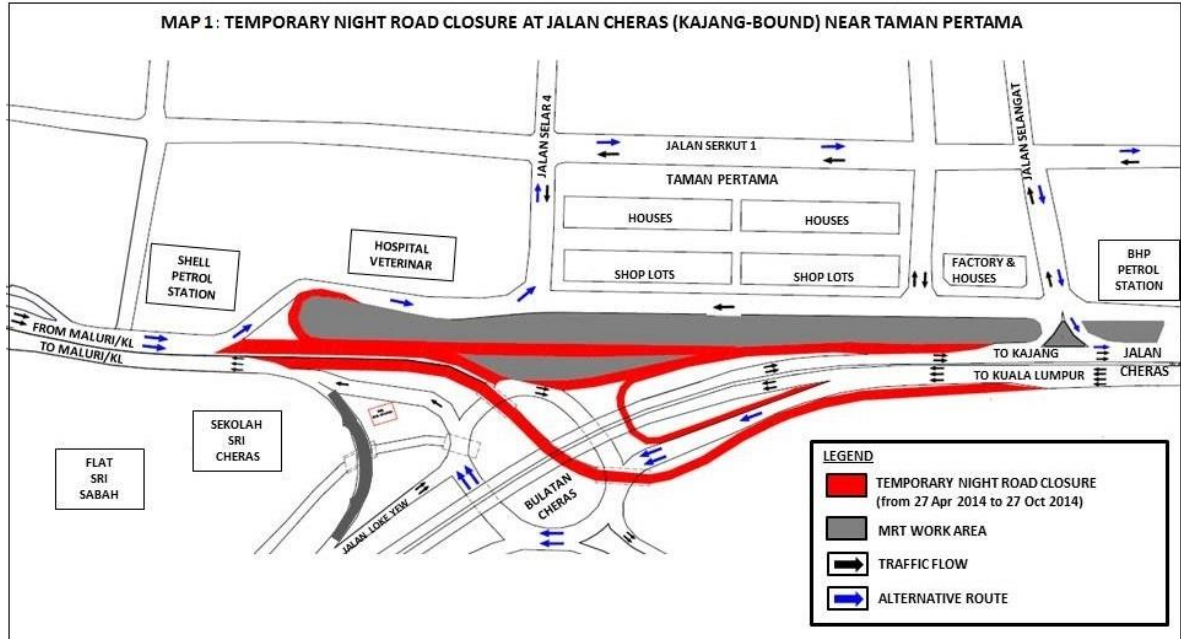
(i) Temporary night road closure at Jalan Cheras, near Taman Pertama (Kajang-bound)

There will be a six-month night road closure at Jalan Cheras (Kajang-bound) near Taman Pertama which will be implemented intermittently, **until 27 October 2014, between 10:00pm and 5:00am daily.**

As an alternative to access Jalan Cheras (Kajang-bound), motorists coming from Maluri/Kuala Lumpur are advised to enter Taman Pertama near the Shell petrol station, make a left-turn to Jalan Selar 4 near the Veterinary Hospital and turn right on the first junction to Jalan Serkut 1, and exit to Jalan Selangit to get onto Jalan Cheras (Kajang-bound).

During this night closure, the U-turn and underpass near the Cheras roundabout (KL- and Maluri-bound) will also be affected. Additionally, motorists from Kajang on Jalan Cheras (KL-bound) heading towards Maluri/Kuala Lumpur are advised to use the Cheras roundabout to get to Maluri/Kuala Lumpur. *(Please see appended Map 1)*

This temporary night closure is necessary to facilitate launching works and construction of the future Taman Bukit Ria MRT Station.



(ii) Temporary night closure at Jalan TSB 8, near Peugeot Showroom and Lorenzo

There will be a temporary night closure at Jalan TSB 8 (near Peugeot Showroom and Lorenzo) **starting tonight until 15 May 2014, between 9:00pm and 5:00am daily.**

During this closure period, motorists will be required to use the following alternative routes (*please refer to appended Map 2*):

- Motorists from Jalan Teknologi 3/3A heading towards Persiaran Sungai Buloh will be diverted to Jalan Teknologi 3/2 (near Kompleks Muhibbah) and turn left to Jalan Teknologi 3/1.
- Motorists from factory lots at Jalan TSB 8 heading towards Jalan Teknologi and Persiaran Surian will be diverted into Persiaran Sungai Buloh and turn right to go to Persiaran Surian.

This closure is necessary to facilitate the installation of the MRT elevated guideway.



(iii) Temporary night traffic diversion at Persiaran Surian and Persiaran Kenanga flyover (Sungai Buloh-bound)

There will be a temporary night traffic diversion at Persiaran Surian near Tropicana Medical Centre and the Persiaran Kenanga flyover (Sungai Buloh-bound) **starting 29 April 2014 to 9 May 2014, between 10:00pm to 5:00am daily.**

During this closure period, motorists are advised to use the following alternative routes (please refer to below Map 3):

- **Motorists on Persiaran Surian (from LDP Highway) heading to Sungai Buloh and PLUS NKVE Highway (Kota Damansara Toll Plaza)**

Motorists will be diverted through Jalan Teknologi (at Tropicana Medical Centre) to join Persiaran Surian.

- **Motorists from PLUS NKVE Highway (Kota Damansara Toll Plaza) heading to Persiaran Surian (Sungai Buloh-bound)**

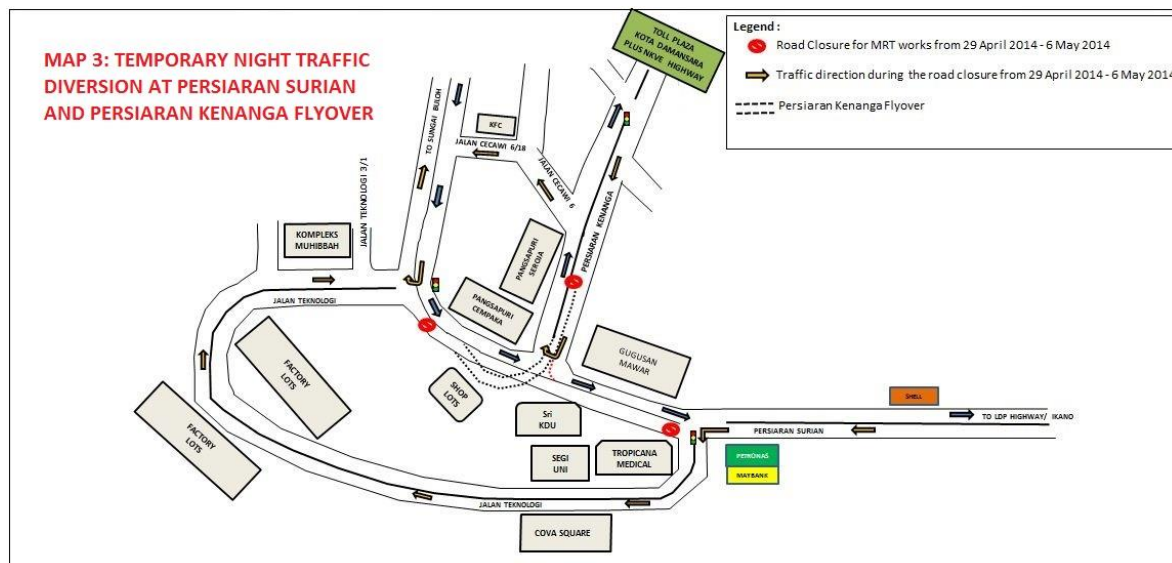
- Motorists will be diverted to make a U-turn underneath the Persiaran Kenanga Flyover, turn left into Jalan Cecawi 6, another left into Jalan Cecawi 6/18, and join Persiaran Surian by making a U-turn at the junction of Jalan Teknologi.

OR

- Motorists continue straight to Persiaran Surian by turning left at the Persiaran Kenanga Flyover, make a right turn at the junction of Jalan Teknologi (near Tropicana Medical Centre) and join back to Persiaran Surian (towards Sungai Buloh-bound).

Motorists heading to LDP Highway via Persiaran Surian remain unaffected during this period.

This temporary night traffic diversion is implemented to accommodate large construction machineries for the construction of the MRT guideway and MRT PJU 5 station.

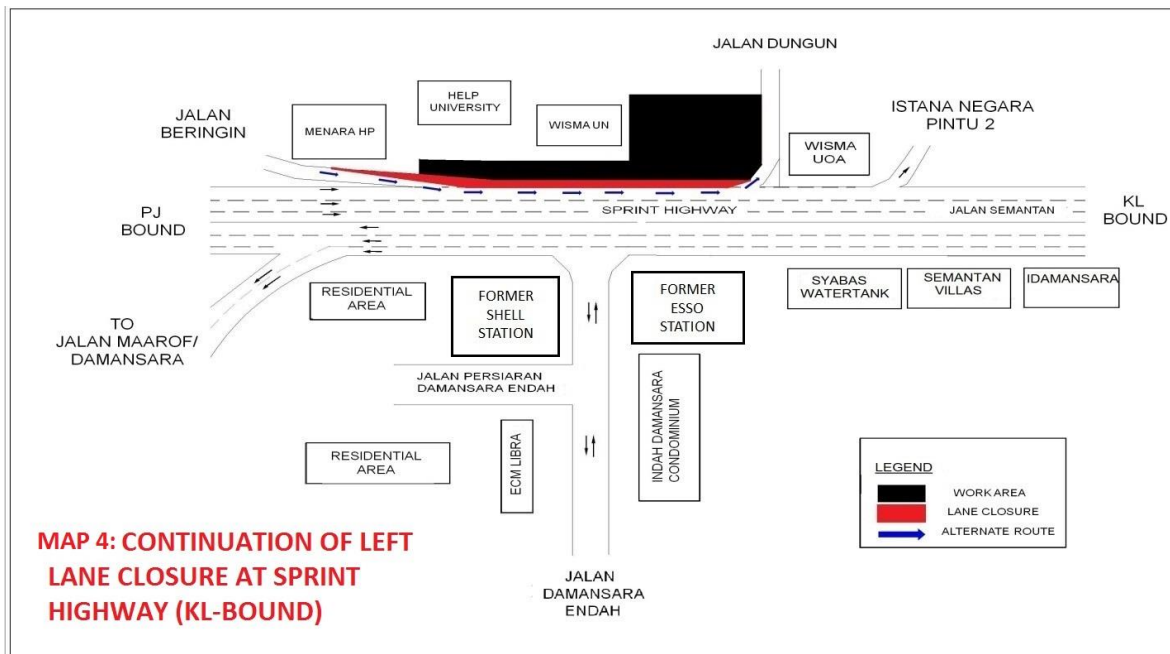


(iv) Continuation of left lane closure at Sprint Highway (KL-bound)

There will be a continuation of the left-most lane closure at the Sprint Highway (Kuala Lumpur-bound) **from 1 May 2014 until 31 July 2014.**

This 200m closure stretch starts at the slip road in front of Menara HP to the junction of Jalan Dungun (KL-bound). *(Please see appended Map 4.)*

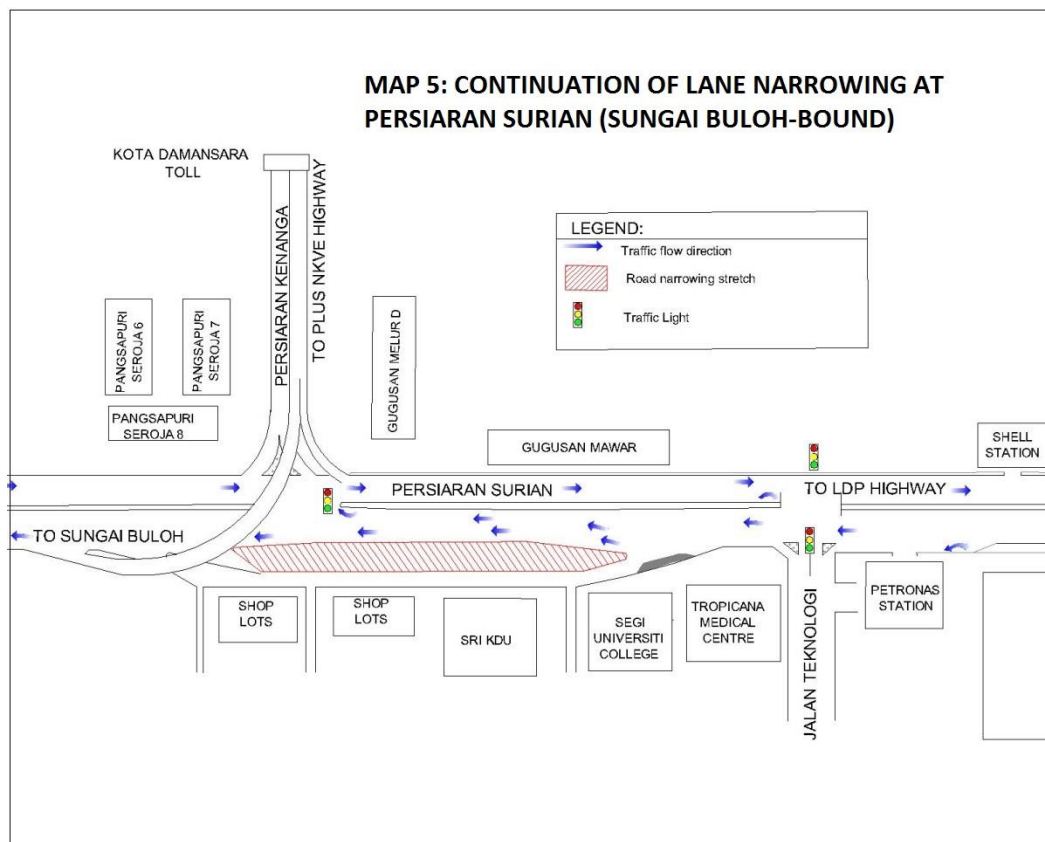
The closure is necessary to facilitate portal works for the future MRT Semantan Station.



(v) Continuation of lane narrowing at Persiaran Surian (Sungai Buloh-bound)

There will be a continuation of lane narrowing at Persiaran Surian (Sungai Buloh-bound) near SEGI College until the junction of Persiaran Kenanga flyover towards PLUS NKVE Highway (Kota Damansara Toll Plaza) **from 1 May 2014 until 31 May 2014**, for a stretch of 300m.

Two traffic lanes will be available to motorists during this period. *(Please refer to appended Map 5).* This closure is necessary to facilitate the installation of launching gantry.

About the MRT Project

MRT is a new rail transport system for the Klang Valley. It is part of the government's Greater Kuala Lumpur/Klang Valley's National Key Economic Area (NKEA), under the Economic Transformation Programme. The Sungai Buloh – Kajang (SBK) Line runs for 51kms, from the north-west town of Sg Buloh to the south-east city town of Kajang. Upon completion, it will comprise 31 stations, and serve 1.2 million people along the route. It will also have strategic integration with KL's existing rail transport network, namely the LRT, Monorail and KTM Komuter, as well as intra and inter-city bus routes. The end result will be better connectivity for KL and its surrounding cities, while reducing the number of cars that enter the capital.

MRT Corp wishes to apologise for any temporary inconvenience caused to the public during the construction of this world-class public transport facility that will benefit Malaysians at large. Motorists are reminded to drive carefully near MRT worksites and to follow directional signs. Safety barriers, hoardings and traffic cones will be installed at the work sites to ensure road users and pedestrians are well-informed of on-going works. In addition, a 24-hour MRT Ronda will be patrolling along the routes to attend to any emergencies.
