# MRT CORP EXTENDS SUPPORT TO STAFF AND FAMILY AFFECTED BY DECEMBER 2021 FLOOD



The recent December 2021 tropical depression had brought upon a massive flood engulfing various areas within eight states in Malaysia, submerging houses and damaging the property of more than 100,000 people nationwide.

Communities were forcibly displaced as the rising water levels washed away their livelihood, with some families rendered homeless for long periods of time as they struggled to rebuild their lives.

In spite of all the calamities, it is through this force of nature that we were able to witness the coming together of Malaysians, people regardless of colour and creed rise in earnest forces, banding together as they offer some sliver of hope to the flood victims.

In response to the natural disaster, MRT Corp through its Strategic Human Resource Division had launched the Flood Relief Aid to provide assistance for its staff as well as the affected communities.

As an initial and immediate action, the 'Tabung Bencana Banjir MRT Corp' was swiftly launched allowing staff members to make contributions to the fund which was then channelled towards helping fellow colleagues affected by the floods.

In mobilising post-flood aid relief, more than 30 volunteers were immediately deployed through various departments, divisions and clubs, including the Kelab Sukan, Rekreasi dan Kebajikan MRT beginning 18 December 2021. The volunteers



have extended their helping hand, cleaning the houses that have been damaged by the rising water levels - moving furniture, laundering soiled clothes and disposing of damaged items - which were among the immediate challenges faced by those affected.

Members of the MRT Corp Leadership Team led by its Chief Executive Officer Datuk Mohd Zarif Hashim visited the homes of the affected staff members on 22 and 23 December 2021, to check on how they were coping with the situation, give words of encouragement and support, and offer immediate assistance. Financial aid was also presented to help them persevere during this difficult time.

Aside from the financial aid and the mobilising of volunteers, MRT Corp also provided temporary accommodation for employees impacted by the flood.

The recent flood directly impacted 11 MRT Corp staff members, whose houses are located in areas such as Ampang in Hulu Langat, Kampung Batu Delima in Kuala Lumpur and Sri Manja in Petaling Jaya, and Klang.



'Tabung Bencana Banjir MRT Corp', the company-wide donation drive successfully raised a total of RM30,084.00, which was then channeled to the flood victims to help refurbish their homes and rebuild their lives. The donation was handed over by Datuk Mohd Zarif Hashim to the 11 MRT Corp staff and their 12 family members during a simple ceremony held at the KVMRT Training Centre in Sungai Buloh on 26 January 2022.

In the same ceremony, an appreciation lunch was also hosted for the volunteers who helped clean up the homes of the flood

victims, of which 21 volunteers were able to attend the event. While addressing the guests, Datuk Mohd Zarif Hashim expressed his gratitude to the volunteers and displayed his appreciation of their voluntary work by personally presenting certificates of appreciation to all the volunteers.

The joint efforts by MRT Corp employees in this time of need demonstrates the spirit of togetherness, one of the five guiding pillars carried by each member of the organisation. 🚗

## MRT CORP REACHES OUT TO B40 COMMUNITIES ALONG THE ALIGNMENT

MRT Corp organised an 'MRT Prihatin 2021' programme at the Program Perumahan Rakyat (PPR) Kota Damansara on 29 November 2021.

With the aim of giving back to the community, the programme saw MRT Corp presenting Zakat Wakalah aid to eligible recipients living in the PPR Kota Damansara area.

It was held in collaboration with the non-profit organisation Persatuan Kebajikan Kembara Insani and Kota Damansara Residence Association (PPRKD). The programme was carried out with strict adherence to the Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) by Majlis Keselamatan Negara.

During the event, members of the MRT Corp Leadership Team handed out the aid to the recipients. Also present were Chairman of Persatuan Kebajikan Kembara Insani Dr Hj Mohd Ali Bahari Abdul Kadir and the Chairman of PPRKD Puan Yuslina Yusuf.

The programme was made possible with the support of 34 volunteers from MRT Corp belonging to various departments and divisions. The combined effort of the volunteers ensured the programme went smoothly, where they provided assistance to the recipients, most of whom were senior



citizens, by helping them carry the donated goods to their doorsteps.

A total of 80 families received the aid. Each family received RM220.00 worth of basic necessities such as food items and toiletries, with the total donation amounting to RM17,600.00. MRT Corp employees also contributed RM2,610.00 to the fund for the event. Among the recipients were the poor, Muslim converts and other eligible recipients that reside within 1km of the PPR Kota Damansara.

The 'MRT Prihatin 2021' programme is the platform for MRT Corp to present zakat wakalah aid to eligible recipients living along the MRT alignments, specifically those who have been adversely affected by the current economic situation.

MRT Corp hopes that the aid provided to the families will alleviate the hardship faced by the families, especially in this time of need. 🙏

With the aim to help underprivileged communities, 100 asnaf or less fortunate people residing near the Sungai Buloh MRT Station received cash aid and food donations worth RM220 for each recipient. 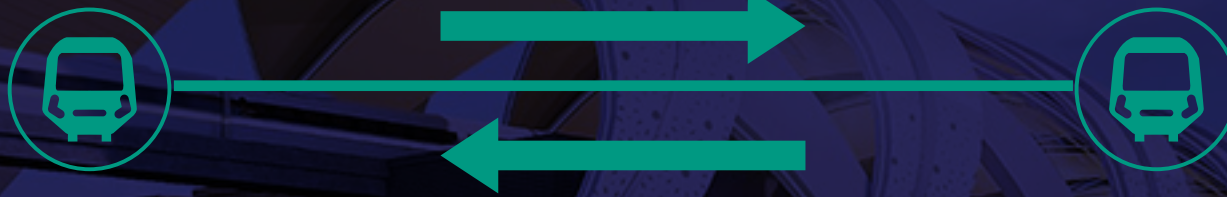

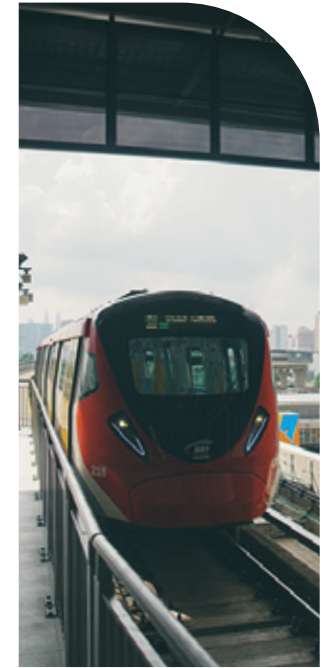

## APAD DIRECTOR GENERAL VISITS MRT PUTRAJAYA LINE PHASE ONE

Land Public Transport Agency (APAD) Director General Datuk Azlan Shah Al Bakri inspected the operational readiness of the stations and trains during a working visit to a number of locations along Phase One of the MRT Putrajaya (PY) Line on 1 November 2021.

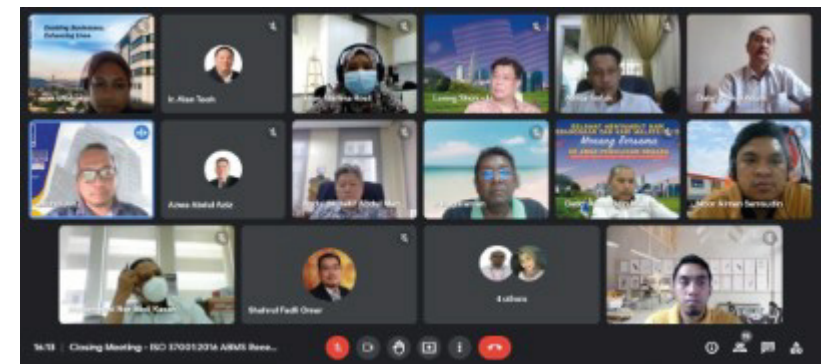


## SIRIM RECERTIFICATION AUDIT (ISO 37001:2016 ANTI-BRIBERY MANAGEMENT SYSTEM)

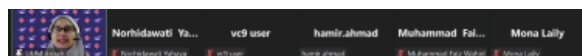

# MRT CORP RISK WEBINAR 2021

A Risk Webinar 2021 was organised by MRT Corp on 2 December 2021, with the aim to promote risk awareness culture within the organisation and foster learning from experienced risk professionals from various industries.

With the theme 'Living Through the Endemic Phase: How to Be Resilient', the webinar brought together a panel of expert speakers for an engaging discussion on how companies can respond and build a systematic resilience approach in the unprecedented global endemic due to Covid-19.

MRT Corp Acting Head of Standard and Compliance Encik Azhar Sofah delivered the welcome address at the beginning of the webinar which saw the attendance of 150 participants.

The webinar commenced with a presentation by AACSB Accreditation Unit, UUM College of Business, Universiti Utara Malaysia (UUM) Director Assoc Prof Dr Arpah Abu Bakar, who was also an Associate Professor, College of Business and Senior Research Fellow at UUM Institute of Risk Management on the topic, 'Sustainable Organisation from The Lens of a Resilient Society'.

The second speaker was Director of Risk Management and Compliance from Malaysia Digital Economy Corporation (MDEC) Puan Sarazin Sheikh Mustafa, who spoke on 'Managing Risk in The Endemic Phase'.

Head of Business Continuity Management at UMW Corporation Encik Mohd Nazlan Eza Mohd Jamzari Wasi was the final speaker and shared his insight and experience on 'Looking Back, Current Trends and Moving Forward'.

The speakers subsequently joined a question and answer session which saw a number of questions from the enthusiastic participants. The webinar also featured fun quizzes to make it more engaging, fun as well as to test the participants' understanding and knowledge of the topics. Ten participants with the highest scores walked away with RM50 worth of F&B vouchers.

The webinar ended with the announcement of the Best Risk Practitioner Award which saw the Electrical and Mechanical Systems Department emerge as the winner. Encik Azhar presented the award to the department representative, Ir Shahir Azhan Mohamed Hamzah who received RM500 worth of F&B voucher.

The Best Practitioner Award was determined based on the following criteria;

1. Implement, maintain and coordinate the Operational Risk Management activities in their respective departments.
2. Ensuring support for the managerial oversight of the delivery of operational risk targets and key result areas.
3. Establish and sustain risk management partnerships.
4. Monitor, review and continually improve risk management activities and processes within their respective departments or organisations.
5. Ensure the implementation of risk management activities is in line with the established MRT Corp's risk management framework.

MRT Corp will continue to strengthen its risk management practises to ensure the organisation is equipped to face any challenges in the future especially during uncertain times. 🚗



# ENVIRONMENTAL MANAGEMENT CAMPAIGN 2021

The annual Environmental Management Campaign organised by MRT Corp Standard and Compliance Division took a turn to virtual space this year, with the theme 'Renewable Energy and Green Technology'. Held from 11 October 2021 - 9 November 2021, the objective was to explore ways to adopt better processes for a sustainable environment.

The campaign began with an Environmental Paper Presentation Competition, open to all Klang Valley MRT project and RTS Link project personnel, including subcontractors. Themed 'Renewable Energy for Railway Infrastructure', the competition aimed to develop the participants' ability to enhance efficiency, promote innovation and develop Renewable Energy in working processes, in achieving a sustainable environment.

The competition, which ran from 11 October 2021 - 2 November 2021, saw ten submissions with seven participants being shortlisted to present their paper online on 2 November 2021 to a panel of judges consisted of Puan Rubita Hani Abdul Samad from Sustainable Energy Development Authority Malaysia (SEDA Malaysia), Encik Muhammad Zaidy Abu Tamin and Ms Suzy Kubong, both from MRT Corp.

During the presentation, the participants were judged based on their clear objectives; originality and creativity; quality of presentation; and how they responded to questions from the judges.

Aside from the paper presentation competition, under the campaign, scheduled infographics on Renewable Energy and Green Technology were shared throughout the organisation, with later a trivia test was organised for MRT Corp employees as a follow up to the infographics.

The Environmental Management Campaign for the year 2021 was officially launched on 9 November 2021 online through a webinar via the Zoom platform by MRT Corp Acting Head of Standard and Compliance Division Encik Azhar Sofah.

The program for the webinar began with the first speaker of the day, Dato' Dr Technologist (Ts) Hj Mohammad Ezanni Mat Salleh from the Department of Environment (DoE),



Kuala Lumpur who delivered the topic 'Energy Conservation Systems'.

In his presentation, he shared on the various steps that can be taken towards energy conservation systems for electricity. He then further shared on the various concepts and systems for energy conservation that are effective in energy saving.

The next speaker, Sr Dr Asmah Alia Mohamad Bohar from Universiti Teknologi Mara (UiTM) who was involved with multiple research projects under various government agencies and departments, then presented on the topic 'The Path Towards Greening the Malaysian Construction Industry'.

In her presentation, Sr Dr Asmah explained the green policies and initiatives currently being implemented by the Government in the construction industry. She then highlighted the importance of green practises in construction in order to reduce carbon footprint, pushing

Malaysia's construction industry towards being more environmentally-friendly.

The third and final speaker for the webinar, Director of Technical Development and Facilitation at SEDA Malaysia Ts Steve Anthony Lojuntin presented the topic 'Green Building and Sustainable Energy Low Carbon Building'.

He presented on the zero-energy building concept, fitting methodology and the assessment tools used in Malaysia. He further highlighted the importance of Low Carbon Building as a strategy that supports the use of efficient green technologies in order to mitigate environmental degradation.

The winners for the Environmental Paper Presentation competition were announced during the webinar, with each winner taking home cash prize and certificate.

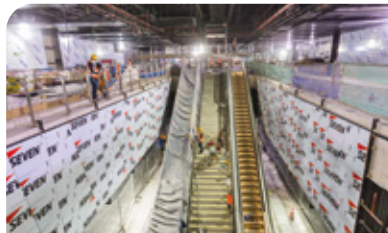
